

## PACD among *Houston Chronicle 100's* top companies

HOUSTON, Texas – Pacific Drilling made its debut in the *Houston Chronicle 100* special section on June 22, ranking among the top Houston companies of 2013 in three out of four categories.

Not bad for six years in business and only one year of fully operating with the initial fleet of four drillships. These highlights can be found in the rankings pages, below:

- Pacific Drilling took No. 95 in the overall ranking of Houston's leading public companies.
- Among the largest companies ranked by 2013 revenue, the company placed No. 100.
- Pacific Drilling is ranked No. 80 in the largest public companies category based on 2013 market value.

According to CFO Paul Reese, if the ranking process had been based on the company's underlying operational results and excluded the impact of its June 2013 financing transaction, Pacific Drilling's ranking would have been even higher.

“Per my calculations, if they used our adjusted EPS figures instead of the book EPS, our EPS growth would have been sixth best – bringing our overall ranking up to 42nd on the list.”

With the addition of the *Pacific Khamsin* and *Pacific Sharav* to the operating fleet in 2014, next year should be even more impressive.

# Where's the money? It's in oil and gas

List of biggest public companies in the Houston area is dominated by heavy hitters in energy

With the exception of the food distribution giant Sysco, the 15 biggest public companies in Houston are all energy all the time. That includes refinery operators, natural gas processors, chemical makers, oil and gas field service

providers and pipeliners.

The next 10 companies on the list of the top revenue generators, compiled annually by the Houston Chronicle, also are mostly in the energy business, including energy-related engineering and construction companies.

"It shouldn't surprise

anybody because energy is so concentrated here," said Patrick Jankowski, vice president of research for the Greater Houston Partnership.

It doesn't hurt that nearly 25,000 oil wells were drilled in Texas last year, Jankowski said. Just two years earlier there were barely 8,800 drilled.

"We're poking holes all over Texas this year, and every time we poke a hole, it seems as if oil

The increase is helping the oil field service providers, engineering firms and

construction companies that depend on the strength of oil and gas exploration and production.
