**Summary:** On August 15, 2020 at approximately 1545 hours, PG&E experienced an outage on its Saratoga 1114 12kV circuit which impacted 4,570 customers. PG&E responders to the outage found wires down on the circuit across Lawrence Expressway and Interstate 280 in San Jose. A grass fire had burned an approximately quarter acre area in the area of the wires down. Near the wires down location, PG&E observed that a dead tree had fallen onto a pole down guy. PG&E is reporting this incident to the CPUC under the significant media criteria due to news coverage by KPIX, KTVU, KGO-TV, and SFGATE. PG&E is not aware of any injuries, fatalities, or property damage exceeding \$50,000. This information is preliminary.
