Current Situation:

The Dixie fire had significant fire activity today and continues to burn South East towards Bucks Lake. The fire is burning in remote areas with limited access, extended travel times, and steep terrain challenges with containment. Large pyro-cumulous clouds formed over the fire and produced a large smoke column which increased fire activity. A portion of SR 70 is closed to all traffic. Firefighters continue to fight aggressively. Additional resources from throughout the State are arriving to help support local resources and manage the incident to protect the communities and values at risk.
