Political Contributions Report

Delta Air Lines is subject to extensive regulation internationally and at the federal, state and local levels of government in the U.S. Regulations by governments in the U.S. and around the world have a significant impact on our business. Therefore, engagement in the legislative and regulatory process is necessary to our success and is in the best interest of stockholders. We regularly present our views on public policy and regulatory matters, and proposed laws and regulations to public officials at the federal, state and local level.

Corporate Political Contributions

We participate in the political and public policy process and make political contributions to candidates, political parties and political committees. All political contributions comply with applicable laws, and we disclose our contributions publicly as required by law. Our Executive Vice President and Chief Legal Officer and the Senior Vice President – Government Affairs, in consultation with members of Company senior management, oversee all of our political engagements, including any use of funds to further our legal, regulatory and public policy interests. The Corporate Governance Committee of the Board of Directors periodically reviews our political contributions. In addition, consistent with the law, we do not make direct contributions to candidates for federal political office. Management regularly consults with outside counsel to ensure political activities are consistent with applicable federal, state and local laws.

The Company is a member of the largest trade association for the domestic airline industry, Airlines for America (A4A), one mission of which is to advocate on behalf of member airlines. The Company paid annual dues to A4A in 2014. Based on information from A4A, 21% of the dues paid to A4A in 2014 were attributable to non-deductible government advocacy expenses. The Company also paid annual dues to the International Air Transport Association (IATA). The Company did not receive information from IATA stating that any portion of the dues was attributable to non-deductible expenses. The Company is also a member of various chambers of commerce at the state and local level which may participate in public advocacy matters.

Voluntary Political Participation by Employees

Company employees are free to support the political process in a variety of ways, such as through personal contributions or by volunteering their personal time to candidates or organizations of their choice. The Company provides an opportunity for our employees to voluntarily participate in the political process by joining the Company's non-partisan political action committee, the Delta Air Lines PAC.

Pursuant to law, the political contributions made by the Delta Air Lines PAC are funded by the voluntary contributions of employees, and decisions about participation in the PAC have no bearing on an employee's career at the Company. The Delta Air Lines PAC is subject to comprehensive government regulation, including detailed disclosure requirements which involve filing monthly reports with the Federal Election Commission. These reports are publicly available, and provide an itemization of the PAC's receipts and disbursements, including its contributions to candidates, party committees and any other organizations.
