Kirazlı Gold and Silver Project Factsheet

Alamos Gold (“Alamos” or the “Company”) is a Canadian-based intermediate gold producer with four operating mines in Canada and Mexico, and development projects in Turkey, Canada, Mexico and the United States. Environmental care is a core value of Alamos Gold with this applied in the same manner across operations in every jurisdiction. The Company has been operating mines in Mexico and Canada since 2005 in accordance with the highest environmental standards. These high-level environmental standards have been applied to the design, construction, and ultimate operation and reclamation of the Kirazlı Gold and Silver Project (“Kirazlı Project”).

Alamos has been working in Turkey since 2010. Since then, the Company has been engaged in consultation with various government ministries and local communities, while working on a multi-year environmental review and community consultation process. The Company was granted approval of the Environmental Impact Assessment, Forestry Permit, GSM and Operating Permit from the relevant regulatory authorities. These permits were granted after passing a rigorous environmental review process, and securing the support from local communities.

Alamos’ projects in Turkey are expected to create over 2,000 jobs in Turkey, between direct and indirect employment. Additionally, these Turkish projects are expected to generate substantial economic benefit to the Turkish economy. Specifically, these projects are expected to result in a US\$500 million benefit to the Turkish economy through the payment of state royalties, land payments and fees, employment, social security and corporate income taxes over a 15-year period.

Incorrect information regarding the Kirazlı Project has recently circulated on social and other media. The Company has prepared the following summary of key facts to correct this misinformation.

The Kirazlı Project is not located in the Kaz Dağları Mountains National Park as has been stated. It is located 40 kilometers from the Kaz Dağları Mountains National Park (see map below).

The Kirazlı Project will not have any negative impact on Atikhisar Reservoir. The Kirazlı Project is located approximately 30 kilometers away from Çanakkale city center and approximately 14 kilometers from the Atikhisar reservoir. The Kirazlı Project will not be sourcing water from the Atikhisar reservoir and the processing facilities for the project are located outside the Atikhisar reservoir watershed. Technically and geographically, it is impossible for the project to have an adverse effect on the Atikhisar reservoir. In fact, the Company is in the process of

constructing an independent water reservoir that will provide water for the operation as well as clean drinking water for the nearby communities.



Claims regarding the unauthorized clearing of trees. As part of the above noted multi-year environmental review and community consultation process, the Company was granted Forestry Permits allowing for 354 hectares to be cleared. Approximately 97% of the Kirazlı Project is located on State Forestry Land.

As part of the site remediation activities, all 354 hectares will be reclaimed and reforested. In fact, in order to be granted Forestry Permits in Turkey, a reforestation commitment is required. This commitment was made by the Company and will be completed upon closure of the mine. In addition, the Company has already planted 14,000 trees in the region.

Claims that water and soil will be contaminated with cyanide are false. Cyanide or any derivative of cyanide is never used in gold exploration or the mining process. Cyanide is only used in the processing stage and utilized within a closed circuit, meaning no cyanide is allowed out of the circuit and into the surrounding environment. During the processing stage, gold is separated from the extracted ore in dedicated, protected and impermeable containment facilities, following strict procedures. This all occurs under the supervision of the relevant governmental authorities and in adherence to the principle of 'zero discharge'.

Alamos has been safely using cyanide at its operations since 2005. Our Kirazlı Project has been designed to the highest environmental standards. In addition to usage in the mining industry, cyanide is used safely throughout Turkey across several other industries including in the manufacturing of textiles, paper and plastics. According to Gold Miners Association of Turkey, only 3% of the cyanide usage in Turkey is by the gold mining industry with the remaining 97% used across several other industries.
