Summary: The Blue Fire started on June 29, 2021 in the Sierra National Forest, northeast of Fresno, in a Tier 2 High Fire Threat District area. The United States Forest Service (USFS) is the authority having jurisdiction over the fire response. The USFS reported the fire was 85% contained at 400 acres as of July 2, 2021 with the fire fully surrounded by hand lines, bulldozer lines, and roads. On July 1, 2021, the USFS asked PG&E for assistance collecting some PG&E facilities in the area of the fire. Per the USFS's request, on July 5, 2021, PG&E personnel arrived at a span of PG&E conductor on the Auberry 1101 12kV Circuit near Big Creek Road and Soaproot Saddle Road south of Shaver Lake in Fresno County. The PG&E crews assisted the USFS, which collected and retained PG&E equipment including conductor and crossarms. At

the location, PG&E observed that a tree that was approximately 100 feet tall and approximately 20 feet from PG&E lines had apparently fallen into the lines and tumbled downhill of the lines. PG&E is reporting this incident due to significant media coverage on the Blue Fire and USFS investigation and collection of PG&E assets in the area of the fire. PG&E is not aware of any fatalities, injuries, or property damage caused by the Blue Fire. This information is preliminary.
